The CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, protect and save harmless the COUNTY, its agents, servants and employees from and against any and all suits, claims, losses, demands, or damages of whatever kind or nature arising out of or claimed to arise out of the alleged violation. The CONTRACTOR shall, at its own expense, appear, defend and pay any and all charges for legal services and any and all costs and other expenses arising from such action or administrative proceeding or incurred in connection therewith. In any and all complaints brought pursuant to the COUNTY'S grievance procedure, the CONTRACTOR agrees to abide by any decision of the COUNTY which is rendered pursuant to said grievance procedure. If any action or administrative proceeding is brought against the COUNTY or any of its agents, servants and employees, the COUNTY shall expeditiously forward or have forwarded to the CONTRACTOR every demand, complaint, notice, summons, pleading, or other process received by the COUNTY or its representatives.

It is expressly agreed and understood that any approval by the COUNTY of the services provided by the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this contract will not relieve the CONTRACTOR of the obligation to comply with the Act and to defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless the COUNTY pursuant to this paragraph.

It is further agreed and understood that the COUNTY assumes no obligation to indemnify or save harmless the CONTRACTOR, its agents, servants, employees and subcontractors for any claim which may arise out of their performance of this Agreement. Furthermore, the CONTRACTOR expressly understands and agrees that the provision of this indemnification clause shall in no way limit the CONTRACTOR'S obligations assumed in this Agreement, nor shall they be construed to relieve the CONTRACTOR from any liability, nor preclude the COUNTY from taking any other actions available to it under any other provisions of this Agreement or otherwise at law.

INTRODUCTION

The County of Ocean is a County of Fifth Class as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:6-1 et seq. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq., the County of Ocean requests qualifications from vendors capable of providing Online Auction Services for Vehicles and Equipment for a two (2) year contract term.

The successful vendor(s) must have a minimum of two (2) years' experience in providing Online Auction Services for Vehicles and Equipment.

SCOPE OF WORK

Ocean County seeks responses for an auctioneer service to catalog, inventory, and auction off items such as vehicles, trucks, construction equipment, tools, industry machinery and miscellaneous property in order to obtain the maximum financial return on behalf of Ocean County. Due to the vast and diverse array of inventory, Ocean County requires the successful vendor to be have specialized and qualitative training and reputation in this field to appropriately meet the needs of this solicitation.

1. Platform

Auctions shall be hosted online. Vendors should be able to demonstrate how they intend to fairly and equally adjudicate auctions on their website. All items shall be available to all members of the public. All potential buyers participating in the auction shall have an equal and fair opportunity in accordance with auctioneering best practices and any applicable laws or regulations.

Vendors should submit their website information and URL so that the County can adequately review each bidder's auction website functionality.

2. Work

The successful vendor shall perform all preparations, labor, and general management for the online auctions.

a. This shall include, but not be limited to:

- Inventorying and cataloging all items that the County wishes to auction at a given event, items will be located in Ocean County
- hosting the secure online platform
- helping potential buyers to register online
- conducting the online auction
- fairly and impartially adjudicating/resolving the auction process
- conducting transactions and payments
- exchanging sold items to winning buyers
- managing any paperwork and documentation
- record keeping
- other duties and assignments as required to execute this contract.

- b. The County will provide a list of the items to be auctioned.
- c. The County will meet with the successful vendor for a kick-off meeting to determine auction dates.
- d. The successful vendor shall provide detailed information and pictures on their website for online buyers to adequately view and judge the quality of the items for auction.
- e. The successful vendor shall be available to handle the pick-up of the sold items by the winning bidders. The County shall not pay for or be held responsible for delivering sold items.
- f. The successful vendor shall comply with and observe the Code of Ethics of the National Auctioneers Association.
- g. The successful vendor shall work with the County to facilitate all paperwork regarding the transference of titles and deeds associated with sales of vehicles sold at auction in accordance with applicable law.
- h. At its discretion, the County may set a starting bid or reserve price for any given item.
- i. Ocean County employees shall not be allowed to bid at auctions under these specifications in accordance with County policy. Law enforcement personnel employed by or within the State of New Jersey shall not be allowed to bid on any forfeited items in accordance with New Jersey state law.

3. Advertising and Marketing

- a. The successful vendor should have an advertising and marketing model across various forms of social media, radio, television, etc. The successful vendor should also have a reliable and comprehensive clientele list to reach as many potential buyers as possible.
- b. The successful vendor shall perform and manage advertising campaigns prior to each auction event. Advertising shall reach the broadest audience possible via mediums such as television, radio, and social media. The online component of the auction services shall give people from all over the United States access to these auctions, and accordingly, marketing campaigns shall reach just as broad of an audience. Additionally, the successful vendor shall make every effort to advertise extensively in the local Ocean County region to attract as many potential buyers as possible.
- c. Ocean County shall not be obligated to pay for, manage, or produce any advertisements or marketing campaigns under this contract, but the County reserves the right to approve all advertisements and marketing campaigns. The County will place a legal advertisement of the auction in a newspaper of the County's choosing.

4. Schedule and Venue

- a. Specific auction dates shall be scheduled at times that are mutually agreeable to the County and the successful vendor. These dates will be determined at the kick-off meeting for each auction held.
- b. The County does not guarantee the successful vendor a minimum or specific number of auctions or items sold. The County estimates four (4) auctions per year. The County reserves the right to increase or decrease the number of auctions to meet its needs.

5. Financials

- a. Ocean County shall pay the successful vendor a percentage of total gross sales (also referred to as a Commission or Seller's Premium). The percentage of gross sales shall not include the Buyer's Premium. Ocean County shall not pay any additional fees, fines, or costs for any aspect of the auction or advertising services provided in these specifications.
- b. The successful vendor may establish his/her own Buyer's Premium. Any amount charged shall be of fair market value, equally charged to all buyers, and meet all local, state, and federal regulations and laws for auctioning services.
- c. The successful vendor shall provide Ocean County with a Guarantee of Payment. When an item is sold at auction, the successful vendor shall guarantee, and personally pay for, the County's portion of the sale should the buyer default on his/her purchase. The item in question shall become the property of the successful vendor. The Guarantee of Payment shall apply to all items sold at auction under this contract.
- d. The successful vendor shall provide the County with its portion of the sales profit within fourteen calendar (14) days of any auction.
- e. The successful vendor shall keep detailed reports of each auction. This shall include:
 - Description of the item sold (with accompanying information, i.e. vehicle identification number);
 - total sale price;
 - Buyer's Premium;
 - Seller's Premium;
 - any applicable taxes paid; and
 - copies of sale receipts, payment receipts, and item ticket stubs.

The successful vendor shall supply the County with a copy of each such report after every auction event. Such reports shall include all transactions.

- f. The successful vendor shall be responsible for paying any applicable taxes associated with auction sales.

6. Cost

Vendors shall submit their proposed Seller's Premium, also known as the Commission, and their Buyer's Premium in the appropriate question of the vendor questionnaire. This is the percentage of gross sales (not including any Buyer's Premiums) that the successful vendor shall keep as their compensation for all services provided under this contract. The remainder shall be turned over to the County.

Vendors shall also submit their proposed Buyer's Premium for the contract.

These figures shall remain in place for the duration of the two (2) year contract.

AWARD

The County of Ocean shall award a contract to the vendor or vendors that best meet the needs and interests of Ocean County. The County reserves the right to negotiate the terms and conditions of a contract with the successful vendor or vendors to obtain the most cost advantageous services for the County.

The County reserves the right to reject any or all proposals in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2, or to waive any informalities and non-material defects in the proposals and to accept any proposal deemed in the best interest of the County.

It is to be understood by the proposer that their proposal is submitted on the basis of specifications prepared by the County and the fact that any proposer is not familiar with these specifications or conditions will not be accepted as an excuse.

INDEMNITY CLAUSE

The proposer, if awarded a contract, agrees to protect, defend and save harmless the County against any damage for payment for the use of any patented material process, article or device that may enter into the manufacture, construction or form a part of the work covered by either order or contract, and he further agrees to indemnify and save harmless the County from suits or actions of every nature and description brought against it, for, or on account of injuries or damages received or sustained by any party or parties by, or from any of the negligent acts of the contractor, his servants or agents.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The contractor shall maintain primary insurance to protect against all claims under Worker's Compensation, Comprehensive General Liability and Automobile. Except for Worker's Compensation, all coverage shall apply as primary coverage with respect to any other insurance or self-insurance program afforded to the County. There shall be no endorsement or modification of this coverage to make it excess over other available insurance/coverage; alternatively, if the CGL and umbrella, excess of reinsurance states that it is pro rata, it shall be endorsed to be primary with respect to the County. Primary coverage shall be subject to approval for adequacy of protection as per the following limits:

Worker's Compensation

1. Limits according to Worker's compensation Laws of the State of New Jersey.
2. Contractor's Liability not less than \$100,000.

Comprehensive General Liability

1. Bodily Injury - \$500,000 per person; \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
2. Property Damage - \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

Comprehensive General Liability shall include the following:

1. Coverage for explosion, collapse or underground hazards.
2. Occurrence basis coverage.
3. Broad form property damage coverage.
4. Coverage for personal injury sustained by any person as a result of an offense directly or indirectly related to the employment of such person by the insured.

Comprehensive Automobile Liability shall include the following:

Business auto liability insurance or its equivalent with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per accident and including coverage for all of the following:

- a. Liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of any auto;
- b. Auto non-ownership and hired car coverage.
- c. Contractor's Worker's Compensation, Comprehensive General Liability and Comprehensive Automobile Liability arising out of subcontractor's operations shall be identical as that listed above.

Copies of each insurance certificate shall be furnished to the County with Proposal (when requested).

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Payments will be made upon the approval of vouchers submitted by the successful proposer in accordance with the requirements of the Board of Commissioners and subject to the Board of Commissioners customary procedures. The County will not pay interest or late fees regardless of language provided.

The County of Ocean is exempt from any State sales tax or Federal excise tax.

Ocean County Board of Commissioners will make award within sixty (60) days after receipt of proposals.

“All contractors must comply with the provisions of New Jersey Statute Title 40A:11-18, when applicable.”

PAY TO PLAY REQUIREMENTS

Starting in January 2007, all business entities are advised of their responsibility to file an annual disclosure statement of political contributions with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC) pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.27 if they receive contracts in excess of \$50,000 from public entities in a calendar year. CERTIFICATION OF NON-INVOLVEMENT IN PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES IN IRAN

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-58, the proposer must certify that neither the proposer, nor one of its parents, subsidiaries, and/or affiliates (as defined in N.J.S.A. 52:32-56(e)(3)), is listed on the Department of the Treasury's List of Persons or Entities Engaging in Prohibited Investment Activities in Iran and that neither is involved in any of the investment activities set forth in N.J.S.A. 52:32-56(f). If the proposer is unable to so certify, the proposer shall provide a detailed and precise description of such activities. Prior to contract award or authorization, the contractor shall provide the Contracting Agency with a completed Certification on Non-Involvement in Prohibited Activities in Iran.

TRANSITIONAL PERIOD (excluding Professional Contracts)

In the event services are terminated by contract expiration or by voluntary termination by either the Contractor or the County of Ocean, the Contractor shall continue all terms and conditions of said contract for a period not to exceed one month, at the County's request.

NEW JERSEY BUSINESS REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:32-44, Ocean County (“Contracting Agency”) is prohibited from entering into a contract with an entity unless the bidder/proposer/contractor, and each subcontractor that is required by law to be named in a bid/proposal/contract has a valid Business Registration Certificate on file with the Division of Revenue and Enterprise Services within the Department of the Treasury.

Prior to contract award or authorization, the contractor shall provide the Contracting Agency with its proof of business registration and that of any named subcontractor(s).

Subcontractors named in a bid or other proposal shall provide proof of business registration to the bidder, who in turn, shall provide it to the Contracting Agency prior to the time a contract, purchase order, or other contracting document is awarded or authorized.

During the course of contract performance:

- (1) the contractor shall not enter into a contract with a subcontractor unless the subcontractor first provides the contractor with a valid proof of business registration.
- (2) the contractor shall maintain and submit to the Contracting Agency a list of subcontractors and their addresses that may be updated from time to time.
- (3) the contractor and any subcontractor providing goods or performing services under the contract, and each of their affiliates, shall collect and remit to the Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the Treasury, the use tax due pursuant to the Sales and Use Tax Act, (N.J.S.A. 54:32B-1 et seq.) on all sales of tangible personal property delivered into the State. Before final payment is made under the contract, the contractor shall submit to the Contracting Agency a complete and accurate list of all subcontractors used and their addresses.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:49-4.1, a business organization that fails to provide a copy of a business registration as required, or that provides false business registration information, shall be liable for a penalty of \$25 for each day of violation, not to exceed \$50,000, for each proof of business registration not properly provided under a contract with a contracting agency.

COMPLETION OF DOCUMENTS

Proposer's shall complete all documents and acknowledge all terms included with this proposal package. All documents should be from this proposal package and must not be dated or executed prior to the date of advertising. Failure to follow these instructions is cause for rejection.

EXHIBIT A

MANDATORY EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY LANGUAGE

N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. (P.L. 1975, C. 127)

N.J.A.C. 17:27

GOODS, PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AND GENERAL SERVICE CONTRACTS

During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will ensure that equal employment opportunity is afforded to such applicants in recruitment and employment, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Such equal employment opportunity shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex.

The contractor or subcontractor will send to each labor union, with which it has a collective bargaining agreement, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer, advising the labor union of the contractor's commitments under this chapter and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq., as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, and labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personnel testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes

and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

In conforming with the targeted employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:

Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval

Certificate of Employee Information Report

Employee Information Report Form AA302 (electronically provided by the Division and distributed to the public agency through the Division's website at www.state.nj.us/treasury/contract_compliance)

The contractor and its subcontractors shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Purchase & Property, CCAU, EEO Monitoring Program as may be requested by the office from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Purchase & Property, CCAU, EEO Monitoring Program for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to **Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.**

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

Equal Opportunity for Individuals with Disabilities

The CONTRACTOR and the COUNTY do hereby agree that the provisions of title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (the "Act") (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by public entities in all services, programs and activities provided or made available by public entities, and the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, are made a part of this contract. In providing any aid, benefit, or service on behalf of the COUNTY pursuant to this contract, the CONTRACTOR agrees that the performance shall be in strict compliance with the Act. In the event that the CONTRACTOR, its agents, servants, employees, or subcontractors violate or are alleged to have violated the Act during the performance of this contract, the CONTRACTOR shall defend the COUNTY in any action or administrative proceeding commenced pursuant to this Act. The CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, protect and save harmless the COUNTY, its agents, servants and employees from and against any and all suits, claims, losses, demands, or damages of whatever kind or nature arising out of or claimed to arise out of the alleged violation. The CONTRACTOR shall, at its own expense, appear, defend and pay any and all charges for legal services and any and all costs and other expenses arising from such action or administrative proceeding or incurred in connection therewith. In any and all complaints brought pursuant to the COUNTY'S grievance procedure, the CONTRACTOR agrees to abide by any decision of the COUNTY which is rendered pursuant to said grievance procedure. If any action or administrative proceeding results in an award of damages against the COUNTY or if the COUNTY incurs any expense to cure a violation of the ADA which has been brought pursuant to its grievance procedure, the CONTRACTOR shall satisfy and discharge the same at its own expense.

The COUNTY shall, as soon as practicable after a claim has been made against it, give written notice thereof to the CONTRACTOR along with full and complete particulars of the claim. If any action or administrative proceeding is brought against the COUNTY or any of its agents, servants and employees, the COUNTY shall expeditiously forward or have forwarded to the CONTRACTOR every demand, complaint, notice, summons, pleading, or other process received by the COUNTY or its representatives.

It is expressly agreed and understood that any approval by the COUNTY of the services provided by the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this contract will not relieve the CONTRACTOR of the obligation to comply with the Act and to defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless the COUNTY pursuant to this paragraph.

It is further agreed and understood that the COUNTY assumes no obligation to indemnify or save harmless the CONTRACTOR, its agents, servants, employees and subcontractors for any claim which may arise out of their performance of this Agreement. Furthermore, the CONTRACTOR expressly understands and agrees that the provision of this indemnification clause shall in no way limit the CONTRACTOR'S obligations assumed in this Agreement, nor shall they be construed to relieve the CONTRACTOR from any liability, nor preclude the COUNTY from taking any other actions available to it under any other provisions of this Agreement or otherwise at law.
