WHEREAS, after the receipt and examination of same, the County Purchasing Agent has now recommended to this Board that the lowest qualified bid according to specifications, in each instance, namely that of, GARY KUBIAK & SON ELECTRIC, INC. and BAHR & SONS ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS, INC. for a secondary Contract for Section I (Item Nos. 1a – 1j) be accepted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:

1. The Director and Clerk of this Board are hereby authorized and directed to enter into contracts for the furnishing and delivery of Electrical Work, for the contract period from date of award through February 6, 2025, OR until delivery is complete unless otherwise stated. The County reserves the right to extend the term of the contract for one (1) additional year by mutual agreement between the County and the Contractor with no increase in base price. Section I and II can be bid singularly. Award shall be per Section. The County reserves the right to award to the two (2) lowest bidders per section. Work orders shall be placed with the lowest bidder first and, if the Contractor is unable to perform the work or meet the time constraints of the County, the County may then offer the job to the next low bidder. If the low bidder already has three (3) or more jobs pending completion and new work needs to be done, the County reserves the right to move to the next low bidder in order to avoid any delay in job completion.

Regulations: (Cont'd)
Contractor is responsible to comply with the New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act (P.L.1963, Chapter 150) and State Labor Laws, specifically to submit certified payroll reports to
The County using department within 10 days of payment of wages to employee.

If Contractor is bidding less than prevailing wage rates, Contractor must still comply with published rate at time of work as applicable under the New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act (P.L.1963, Chapter 150) and State Labor Laws.
